### The Journey from the Head to the Heart

*"For as he thinks in his heart, so he is."*

#### **Proverbs 23:7**

If you are reading this, there is a good chance that you are one of the 70 plus members of our church that have been actively engaged in meeting, reading, studying and growing in a *Believe* small group study.

In this first 5 weeks of the study, we were challenged to "dig deep" into the basic beliefs of the Christian faith. You might wonder why our church embarked on this journey in the first place. The reason is that our beliefs determine in large part the direction of our life and the depth of our faith. Beliefs are the foundation of our faith. The depth of your faith determines your future—both here on earth and for eternity in heaven.

Randy Frazee writes, "The journey of beliefs begins in the head but it must migrate twelve inches south to the heart to make a difference in our lives." Why? Because we live from the heart. **Proverbs 23:7** says, "*For as he thinks in his heart, so he is.*" The writer did not say, "As he thinks in his mind, but rather, how he thinks in his heart. Many people today believe "in their mind" the claims of Christianity. Even Satan's followers believed in Jesus. But it is one thing to believe intellectually in the existence of God or that Jesus was God. It is quite another to believe so deeply in your heart in Jesus that your life, thoughts, motivations and priorities begin to align with your love for him and your desire to become like Him. And those beliefs can transform our lives in powerful ways.

When I was still teaching golf for a living, I attended a teaching seminar given by Butch Harmon, one of Tiger Wood's most successful teachers. Butch said something that always stayed with me: He said, "A good golf instructor can spot ten things wrong with someone's golf swing; A great golf instructor can identify the one thing causing the other nine."

The same is true of the Christian life. I may

be able to spot ten things wrong with my life. Maybe it is financial, maybe it is relational, maybe I struggle with fear and anxiety, depression, insecurity, or any number of other challenges. But when I examine my beliefs, I can spot the one thing causing the other nine. Maybe there is something that I believe in my head to be true about my faith, but it doesn't yet reside in my heart. Maybe I have had a question about the truths of Christianity, but I have never had the freedom to explore it.

Frazee concludes, "The journey of belief from head to heart is almost always coupled with and fueled by a season of questioning. We must create an environment in the church where we are encouraged to speak our questions aloud. That is what the *Grow Team* along with our group facilitators have created for you here at Cheviot UMC.

I pray that you have taken advantage of this great opportunity and are as excited as I am to continue this journey from the head to the heart.

Sometime ago I was sharing with a group here at church about the Trinity. I was not satisfied with what I knew and began to do some searching. What I found led me to a better understanding of what our God is like.

We say God is three-in-one: The *Father* is God. The *Son* is God, and the *Holy Spirit* is God. And yet, the Father is not the Son, and the Son is not the Father and the Holy Spirit is not the Father or the Son. And yet, all three are God.

As I read on, it said that God is of One "essence" which eternally exists in three separate Persons. "Essence" is defined as the basic, real nature of something. It contains the characteristic properties of something, the inward nature, the true substance of something.

How would you describe God? What is His nature? By yourself, or as a family, make a good list. We would say God is love, mercy, forgiveness, just, holy, truth, faithful and the list goes on and on.

So, if the "essence" of God is love, then it is true that the Father is love, the Son is love, and the Holy Spirit is love. If the essence of God is faithful then the Father is faithful, the Son is faithful, and the Holy Spirit is faithful. If all three Persons are God and God is of one essence, then all three are always and forever the same. The Father cannot have a different essence than the Son or the Holy Spirit, nor they of the Father or of one another.

**Galatians 5:22,23** tells what the Fruit of the Holy Spirit is. This fruit is also the fruit of the Father and the Son. The reason why the Scriptures tells us they are the fruit of the Holy Spirit is because when Jesus went back to Heaven, He sent the Holy Spirit to earth to live in all those who are believers in Christ. So they indeed are the fruit of God Himself as He lives in us through His Holy Spirit.

While of one "essence," each Person of the Godhead has a different function or role. To look at the Father's function we can zero in on the Lord's Prayer as Jesus prayed to the Father. Our Heavenly Father is our Provider, our Protector. This is the role of all good earthly fathers also. He forgives us and keeps us from sin as we ask Him. We see His role and function abundantly as Jesus prays to Him in the Gospel of John chapter 17.

The Son's function is different. He came to this earth to fulfill His Father's will. He came to earth to be our Savior, to show us what God the Father is like, to lead us into all Truth, to be the Way to Heaven and Eternal Life. His function is totally

different from the Father's. The Holy Spirit's function is also different. He is our teacher as we read God's Word and walk with God. He encourages us, guides us, strengthens us, counsels. He draws us to God and convicts us of our sins. He bears God's fruit in us and gives all Christians gifts to use in the body of Christ, the Church.

As I was reading and thinking, the song "They'll Know We are Christians by our Love" came to me. We have sung it many times, and now I understand it even better. You see, the essence of God is love!

If you want to know what this love is like, read First Corinthians 13. And God the Holy Spirit comes to live in us the moment we receive God the Son, Jesus, as our Personal Savior bringing that love into us, to glorify God the Father. No matter where we meet other members of God's family across the world, that same love will be manifested in us. We may not be able to speak the same language, yet that love of God will shine through us to each other as Christians, as the "essence of true love" is God. Jesus said, "By this will everyone know you are My disciples; your love for one another will be the evidence."

Currently Pastor Carrie and the Grow team are leading us in the study "Believe". In the very first session we talked about God as Trinity. God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And all share the essence of "love".


The "essence" of God's love permeating our church family and reaching out into the world is the ONLY ANSWER to the deepest needs and longings of all of us.

God, as Holy Spirit, fills us with God's love when we open wide our hearts to Jesus and invite Him to live in us and through us. And doing so shows the world God the Father.

God is Father, God is Son and God is Holy Spirit, blessed Trinity. Each Person of the Godhead is functioning through the essence of God's love to bring the world back to Himself. And we have the privilege of being His servants in the world to make that happen.

"For God so loved the world that He (the Father) gave His only Begotten Son (Jesus) so that whosoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life (as the Holy Spirit witnesses to us).

We believe in God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, Blessed Trinity.


